




The Cast

The Bride of Dracula, ambitious wannabe WAG:










Villager I and Chorus: JuliePettigrew -

Lynne Grimes - Lynne's second panto with The Worthy Players.


She feels the role of Villager 2 brings her acting career to its zenith. It's a dual role as a zombie, drawing upon her experience of Monday mornings to perfect the part.
